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


OUT-OF-SCHOOL YOUTH PROGRAM

could develop similar programs in their schools.

FIRST RESPONDER TRAINING at Ambulance & Chair EMS, Inc.

Southwest Training recently worked with the Ambulance & Chair EMS, Inc., to support the tuition costs for five out-of-school youth interested in pursuing Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) training/certification.

The EMT program is 188 hours of classroom, online and hands on instruction. When these students complete the program successfully they are then eligible to sit for the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians testing. They will take a cognitive and psychomotor exam. If they pass both tests, they will be certified as EMTs, in Pennsylvania, by the Department of Health, as well as, receive the National Registry certification. Once they are certified, they can pursue a career path as an EMT or further their education beyond this.



They created more anxiety for me. I get anxious and I start to think that I have to rush through my assignments. But in a way, I am thankful for this experience." N.F.

GOT SKILLS?

Imagine two people are interviewing for a job. On paper, both candidates are very qualified. They both have degrees, high GPAs, and a few years of relevant work experience. Going into the interview, both are well-prepared. They've practiced all of the common interview questions, they
