


## **EXPLORE YOUR OPTIONS WITH PA CAREER GUIDE**

The 26th edition of the Pennsylvania Career Guide provides information that can be used by all individuals who are prepar-

ing for continuing education and/or entrance into the workforce. Information that can be found in this guide include career outlook highlights, an interest assessment tool, tips for marketing your-self, sources of financial aid, and contact information for many Commonwealth services, including PA CareerLink<sup>®</sup> locations and select state agencies. ## **8 WAYS YOU CAN EXPLORE A CAREER PATH**

Have you ever felt as though you needed to have your whole life figured out right now or before you even graduate high school. Guess what? You don't have to have it all figured out. Life is something we are all trying to figure out! There are some things we can do to help us start making progress toward the kind of life we want to live and the way we dream of spending our time. Here is a list of eight ways to explore your career path right now. It's just a start...

**1.** Think of your career path as a stepping stone—Did you know that the average person changes careers at least twice in their lifetime? When it comes to careers, nothing is permanent. If you think of your career as a stepping stone, you stay open to exploring new interests and talents throughout adulthood. Think of the ABC's of job search. To clarify, <u>ABC</u> means <u>A</u> job (entry-level/get your foot in the door), <u>Better job</u> (leveling up in your career. ## **8 Ways You Can Explore Career Path Options**

**2. Make a career plan**—How are you going to get to where you want to be? Where will you start? Consider exploring careers like artist, set designer, technical writer, or aviation mechanic. There are literally thousands of careers to choose from.

**6. Find a mentor**—A mentor is someone you trust who has experience in areas you might need guidance. Your mentor can help you make life decisions about academic majors and your career focus. A good mentor will give you advice when you need it, and encourage you to keep going when it gets challenging.

**7.** Get an internship—An internship is great because you can earn money while you gain experience in a certain area. You might find that you love the career path you want to pursue, or that it really isn't something that interests you much at all. Learn as much as you can to help you decide if this is the right path for you.

## Senior Highlight: McKenna Hewitt – California Area High School


McKenna Hewitt is a senior at California Area High School.



### **Counselor Spotlight:** Dr. Jamie Brownfield – Ringgold High School

My name is Dr. Jamie N. Brownfield. After earning a Bachelor's degree in Psychology from California University of Pennsylvania in 2001, I worked as a Therapeutic Staff Support for children and adolescents with dual diagnoses including Attention Deficit Hyperactive Disorder, Autism Spectrum Disorder, and Mental Retardation.

Following graduation, I pursued a Masters degree in Elementary and Secondary School Counseling at California University of PA. In 2004, I was hired by the Ringgold School District, as an elementary school counselor for two years, and then transferred to the middle school in 2006 where I had worked as a middle school counselor until January 2022 which is when I started as the Transition Counselor at Ringgold High School.

While working as a school counselor in the Ringgold School District, I earned

my Doctoral Degree in Counselor Education & Supervision from Duquesne University in May 2012. During my time at Duquesne University, I also became a Licensed Professional Counselor. I currently work part time as a therapist, helping children, adolescents, and their families live up to their full potential by overcoming life obstacles. With sincere interest and a varied approach, I have helped people by focusing not only on the individual, but also the family dynamics that influence their well-being. I help individuals access their inner strengths and resources to guide and encourage them to be the best they can be. Oftentimes, this requires helping the person see how the thoughts they have about their situation is contributing to the problems they are in counseling to resolve.

Over the course of my career, I have worked as an adjunct professor at California University of Pennsylvania's



Psychology department to teach Psychopathology of Adult Disorders and a course on the Diagnostic and also taught Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, in the Counseling Department. I am also a member of the Pennsylvania Counseling Association (PCA) and American School Counseling Association (ASCA). I have had the opportunity to present at both PCA and ACA on topics that included school crisis, post-traumatic stress disorder, and the supervision of counselors.

## JUNIOR HIGHLIGHT: Amber Habe — Chartiers-Houston High School


